

# German I - Study List

## Mid-Unit Performance Assessment #1

### Unit I material:

\*Pronouns (*I, you (singular, informal); he; she; it; we; you (plural, informal); they; you (formal)*)

### Unit II material: In addition to all Unit II vocabulary

\*Verb Conjugation endings (*know the endings 'chant' → which pronouns take which endings*)

#### \*Telling time:

- Know BOTH ways of asking 'What time is it?' in German & expressions: **quarter; till; after; half**
- Be able to tell time for even hours (ex. 1:00; 12:00); half-hours (ex. 12:30; 11:30);  
Quarter till (ex. 2:45; 7:45); quarter after (ex. 9:15; 6:15)
- Know the 2-word expressions for 'in the morning/afternoon/evening' (NOT  
REGULARLY) that are used to express 'a.m. / p.m.'

#### \*Asking & telling about daily routine:

- Know the question: "What do you do/what are you doing?"
- Know the 1-word expressions for 'in the morning', 'in the afternoon', 'in the evening' & 'at night' (regularly), so you can ask 'What do you do in the morning?' (regularly)
- Know the following German expressions – including spelling:
  - I get up.                      \*I go to school.                      \* I do homework.
  - I take a shower.                      \*I go home.                      \* I go to bed.
- Know how to combine time expressions with the daily routine sentences, to tell what time you / others do activities (ex. At 5:45 I get up).
- Know the two important verb order rules we've learned

#### \*Asking & telling what people eat for different meals

- Know the question: "What do you like to eat / drink?"
- Know the expressions 'for breakfast / for lunch / for dinner / for dessert'
- Know how to respond to the question, using 'For breakfast I like to eat/drink...'
- Know all the foods & beverages we have learned so far

#### \*Talking about your house / apartment

- In a sentence, be able to tell whether you have a house or an apartment
- Know the German words for all the rooms in the house, including plurals.
- Be able to, in one single sentence, be able to tell how many your house has of each room. (ex. My house has a kitchen, a living room, three bedrooms, etc.)
